With warmer weather appearing, many community gardens are opening. Read these best practices for gardening during this COVID-19 summer. These recommendations are based on public health guidance for both the garden and our communities.

Prepare for Japanese Beetles

With the mild winter, it's possible that we are going to face a bumper crop of Japanese beetles before the Fourth of July. Be ready with the best information on controlling this garden pest.

Murder Hornets are not a problem

It is unlikely that we would see these hornets in MN any time soon. However, should that change, the Minnesota Department of Agriculture (MDA) will take the appropriate action for early detection.
